PISTOL NEWS: (Brianne Wittmeyer, Chair) There is a lot going on with the pistol shooting disciplines:

Niagara Frontier Pistol League – This is a travelling league on various days of the week. Home matches are Monday nights at the Club. This league is for members only and runs through March. Cost is \$4/match for the home range.

<u>Informal Pistol League</u>, "<u>Double Tap</u>, <u>PPC</u> – See the flyer on the left.

Open shoot/practice – Thursday mornings at 10 a.m. and Sunday mornings at 9:30 a.m. Cost is \$5 per person.

Family nights – The last Saturday of the month and the Friday after the member meeting (usually the second Friday) – both these are potlucks and begin at 7:00 p.m. Cost is \$5 per person. Note: Due to the Christmas holiday, there is no Saturday night Family Night on December 28.)

CONSTITUTION AMENDMENT

In order to amend our Constitution, the information must be provided to the membership for three meetings. We then vote for the desired change to take place.

The information was presented at the December 2024 meeting, and it will be presented at the January and February 2025 meetings. The vote will take place at the February 2025 meeting.

Below is an outline of the proposed changes:

Article II. Purposes of Organization Section 3. To sponsor support legislation that will tend to preserve fish, game and natural resources that will be beneficial to all persons interested in angling, hunting or conservation for recreational purposes. Section 4. To actively and aggressively seek and support to repeal of any law, ruling or regulation that may be discriminatory, unfair or unjust in so far as such provision affects the preservation or propagation of fish and game life or which may unduly or unnecessarily restrict the privilege of taking such fish or game, but bringing such facts to the attention of the proper authorities in as forcible a manner as possible. Article VI. Election of Officers and their Terms of Office Section 5. Executive Board vacancies created for any reason will be filled by candidates: a. From the ballots of the year in which the vacancy occurred. b. If the vacancy occurred before March December of that year, such vacancies will be filled with the individual with the highest number of votes who did not receive a Board seat at the time the election was held. If there is a vacancy with no alternative candidate from the prior election, a special election will be held. After December, the vacancy will remain until the next April election. The term will run until the vacated seat expires.3 c. Upon the vacancy of multiple terms, the remainder of that term will be offered to directors of a 1-year term in descending order. That 1-year vacancy will be filled as above. d. Ties to fill any vacancy shall be decided by the flip of a coin. e. Uncontested elections: If there is an uncontested election, rather than the participants automatically winning, an election of acclimation should take place. A ballot vote with a box for 'ves' and a box for 'no' would be used to provide voter anonymity. The greater number of 'yes' or 'no' will determine the outcome. ' ¹ As a club, we do not sponsor or write legislation. ² As a club, we do not actively or aggressively seek to repeal laws, rulings or regulations. ³ Due to vacancies this past year, this issue needed to be addressed. ⁴ Acclimation is the most common option to accept or reject candidates. SOME NOTES ON THE PISTOL RANGE

PLEASE NOTE! The bar and the range cannot be open at the same time. If there is a Club-sponsored activity (i.e. banquet, trap league, etc.) they have precedence over someone coming into the Club for practice. If there is a Club-sponsored event in the range, the bar cannot open until all shooting has concluded. Scheduled/league events take priority over individual practice time.

There also appears to be some confusion regarding <u>pistol range fees</u>. The following applies to non-Club sponsored usage, i.e. coming to shoot outside of leagues.

Members \$10 per person PER HOUR Non-Members \$20 per person PER HOUR Minimum range fee PER HOUR is \$20

- A member comes alone during off-league time to practice. The cost will be \$20 per hour. That is the minimum range fee per hour. There is no pro-rating this fee. If that person practices for 1.5 hours, the fee is \$20 for the first hour and \$20 for the second hour.
- A member comes with two fellow members during off-league time to practice. The cost will be \$10 for each member, per hour (total \$30).
- A member and a non-member come to practice during off-league time. The cost will be $$\stackrel{.}{\circ}10 for the member and $$\stackrel{.}{\circ}20 for the non-member per hour.
